

The Fund provides grants up to $\pm 5,000$ to local organisations and projects that deliver a lasting and positive impact on the local community.

Pat Weller and Ann Tizzard, who accepted the grant award on behalf of Community Action explains how the funding will help reduce crime / improve community safety in Hangleton and Knoll.

Representatives said: "We are delighted to have been awarded this grant from the Commissioner's Community Safety Fund, which will ensure the continuation of Hangleton and Knoll Community Action in our area.

Commending H and K Community Action on its successful bid Mrs Bourne said: "As PCC I have a statutory responsibility for commissioning countywide community safety and crime prevention programmes.

"The group is a great example of an innovative local project that aims to make our communities safer.

"Since launching the Safer in Sussex Fund in December 2013, nearly \pm 1.5 million has been allocated to support over 300 crime reduction and community safety initiatives.

"This money makes a real difference to local people and neighbourhoods. The high numbers of bids each time shows organisations and community groups are committed to keeping Sussex a safe place in which to live."
